

MAR DEL PLATA IS NOT HAPPY: A CITY IN CRISIS

MAR DEL PLATA IS FAMOUS FOR ITS BEAUTIFUL BEACHES, TOURISM, AND CHEERFUL LOCALS, BUT TODAY ITS IMAGE IS IN CRISIS. A RISE IN CRIME, POVERTY, UNEMPLOYMENT, POLLUTION, POOR INFRASTRUCTURE AND LACK OF ORGANIZED URBAN DEVELOPMENT IS RUINING THE LIVES OF THOUSANDS OF CITIZENS.

The lack of safety is the main worry of the locals. According to a research study conducted by FASTA University, 98% of locals believe that crime is the most important problem in the city. The number of robberies and homicides is increasing, especially in the center and the outskirts of the city. Many people are afraid to go out at night and avoid going to some neighbourhoods. The growing crime rate is affecting tourism and businesses because fewer people are visiting the city due to

fear of crime.

Another important problem is poverty and unemployment. 23,5% of families do not have enough money to buy food, clothes, or pay for **housing** and young people have trouble finding jobs. This affects their mental health and their access to further education.



More than 100 people are waiting in line for a job position in a factory.

Mar del Plata is known for its incredible landscapes but the situation has changed. There are microplastics on the beaches and there is trash everywhere. Together with the use of pesticides and dirty water, pollution is affecting people's well-being. Hospitals are reporting more cases of allergies, respiratory diseases, and gastrointestinal problems. Pollution also affects tourism and businesses because the city looks too dirty and unattractive for tourists.

Finally, infrastructure problems make life more difficult for locals. Many streets have **potholes** or have no lights, which increases the risk of accidents and crime. In some areas, there are no basic services like clean water or easy transportation. The lack of urban planning has led to a fragmented city between rich and poor neighbourhoods, widening **inequality**.

All these problems require attention and government measurements to improve the citizens' quality of life. It is crucial that local authorities, social organizations, and the locals work together to face these challenges and build a safer, healthier, and fairer city for everyone.

Buenos Aires: opened all year

If you don't know what to do for your holidays this year, come to Buenos Aires! This city offers endless hours of entertainment, outdoor activities, and much more. Read this guide to discover some of the most beautiful attractions of the world. Buenos Aires is waiting for you!

Rose Garden - Palermo



Located in the Palermo neighbourhood, <u>Parque Tres de Febrero is the most popular park in the city.</u> This garden has a collection of more than 18,000 roses surrounded by a lake. You can have a picnic in the garden or even go for a boat ride on the lake. <u>The rose garden (rosedal in Spanish) is older than other parks: it is more than 100 years old!</u> As well as its roses, it features a Greek-influenced bridge, an amphitheatre, an Andalusian patio and a poets' garden with 26 busts of famous writers including Alfonsina Storni, Dante Alighieri, William Shakespeare and Jorge Luis Borges.

The land for this garden belonged to Juan Manuel de Rosas until he was defeated in the battle of Caseros on February 3th, 1852. French landscaper Charles Thays designed the park and the garden. Benito Carrasco finished construction in 1914.

Galileo Galilei Planetarium



Located in Palermo, this planetarium has a main projection room with a 20-metre dome and reclineable seats in which you can see projections of the stars and planets. The rest of the rooms are smaller than the main room but they are still incredible! You can visit the museum, which has a collection of meteorites from the north of Argentina, and interactive exhibitions and audiovisual shows.

The planetarium has 4D and robot technology, simulators and cutting-edge projection equipment. This year, the city is renovating some of the room for a better experience for the audience.

Details: The price range of the admission tickets is between 3000 and 6000 Argentinian pesos.

El Ateneo Grand Splendid bookstore



According to the British newspaper The Guardian, <u>El Ateneo Grand Splendid is the second best bookstore in the world</u>. Located in the Recoleta neighbourhood, El Grand Spendid theatre opened in 1919 and immediately became an icon of Porteño culture, hosting ballet and opera.

The venue was transformed into a bookstore in the year 2000, beautifully preserving the original decoration, including the dome, which was painted by Italian Nazareno Orlandi.

Caminito



Located in La boca, Caminito (little path, in Spanish) is a street museum of colourful houses. The buildings made of wood and metal are typical of the conventillos, that is, precarious, communal dwellings built by the Italian immigrants in the late 19th century. Caminito followed the route of an old stream that once flowed into the Riachuelo, and later, after the stream dried up, it became part of a railroad route. After the closure of the railroad, the street was largely abandoned until a group of neighbours decided to revitalize in the 1950s.

Today, several works by Argentine artists are part of the street museum and the Caminito has become a favourite of the tourists. Several restaurants offer tango and folk dance shows and artists offer their crafts and paintings.

Galerías Pacífico



Galerías Pacífico is one of the most opulent shopping malls in the city, and many people visit just to see its installations and its dome. The shopping also offers a selection of luxury brands and a food court.

The building, at the intersection of Florida and Córdoba, was constructed in 1889 and was used by the Museo de Bellas Artes until 1940. The building was transformed into a shopping mall in 1990 and has been declared a national historic monument.

Those interested in learning more about the building's history can book a 20-minute guided tour (phone 5555-5110), Monday to Friday at 11.30am and 4.30pm.

Recoleta Cemetery



In this cemetery, there are over 6,400 statues, sarcophagi, coffins and crypts. The Recoleta Cemetery, located in the neighbourhood of the same name, belonged to the Recollect monks. It became the city's first public cemetery in 1822. It was designed by French engineer Próspero Catelin, who also designed the city's Metropolitan Cathedral in the Plaza de Mayo. The most visited tombs are those of Eva Perón and former presidents Sarmiento and Raúl Alfonsín.



The cemetery is open daily from 8am to 6pm. Free guided tours in Spanish take place at 11am and 2pm Tuesday to Friday, and at 11am and 3pm on Saturdays, Sundays and public holidays. Don't forget to pick up a map at the entrance!
